DIVINE MERCY NOVENA

Begins Good Friday at 2PM

Day 1 – 3/30 – Good Friday: *Today bring to Me* all mankind, especially all sinners, and immerse them in the ocean of My mercy.

Day 2 – 3/31 – Holy Saturday: *Today bring to Me* the souls of priests and religious, and immerse them in My unfathomable mercy.

Day 3 – 4/1 – Easter Sunday: *Today bring to Me* all devout and faithful souls, and immerse them in the ocean of My mercy.

Day 4 – 4/2: *Today bring to Me* those who do not believe in God and those who do not yet know Me.

Day 5 – 4/3: *Today bring to Me* the souls of those who have separated themselves from the Church.

Day 6 – 4/4: *Today bring to Me* the meek and humble souls and the souls of little children, and immerse them in My mercy.

Day 7 – 4/5: *Today bring to Me* the souls who especially venerate and glorify My Mercy and immerse them in My mercy.

Day 8 – 4/6: *Today bring to Me* the souls who are detained in purgatory and immerse them in the abyss of My mercy.

Day 9 – 4/7: *Today bring to Me* souls who have become lukewarm, and immerse them in the abyss of My mercy.

Noon **Marian Way of the Cross**
Walk the road to Calvary through the eyes of Mary. A beautiful, moving communal prayer led by women of the Parish.

1:00 p.m. **The Seven Last Words of Christ** – Prayer and song with meditations on Christ's Last words on the Cross. Feel the impact in your own life.

2:00 p.m. **Divine Mercy Novena** – Will be held in the Divine Mercy Alcove.

- 2:00-2:45 Confessions will be heard.
- 3:00 p.m. **Celebration of the Lord's Passion** — Jesus died at 3:00 p.m. We come together to pray, sing and enter into this solemn moment. Dialogue Reading of the Passion, Adoration of the Cross, Communion.
- 6:00 p.m. **Viernes Santo de la pasión del Señor** (Español) Evangelio de la pasión, Adoracion de la Santa Cruz, Sagrada Comunion.
- 7:00 p.m. **Ecumenical Stations of the Cross** — Join other Christians to walk the Stations of the Cross, written by Pope John Paul II. We will be starting at St. Rose Church, then to St. Luke's Lutheran Church and ending at Trinity Methodist Church.

- 8:30 a.m. **Tenebrae Service** - Tenebrae means "Shadows". This is a time of quiet meditation using the Psalms reflecting on the death of Christ. Lighted candles are extinguished one by one as life ebbs from our dying Savior. A beautiful funeral or wake service for our Lord.
- 9:00 a.m. **Divine Mercy Novena** - Will be held in the Divine Mercy Alcove.
- 8:00 p.m. **The Easter Vigil** - This is the most important and most beautiful liturgy of the Church Year. Our salvation occurs through the death and resurrection of Christ. We keep vigil with Christ as we await his resurrection.
- At this service, the Paschal (Easter) Candle is blessed in a beautiful and moving ceremony. From the Paschal Candle, candles held by everyone in the congregation are lit, as the Light of the Risen Christ fills the Church and our hearts.
 - We hear readings from the Old and New Testaments showing the action of God throughout history leading to Christ.
 - New members of the Church are baptized and welcomed to our community.
 - Bells are rung as we sing the Glory to God ending Lent and celebrating our new life in the Risen Christ. Alleluia!

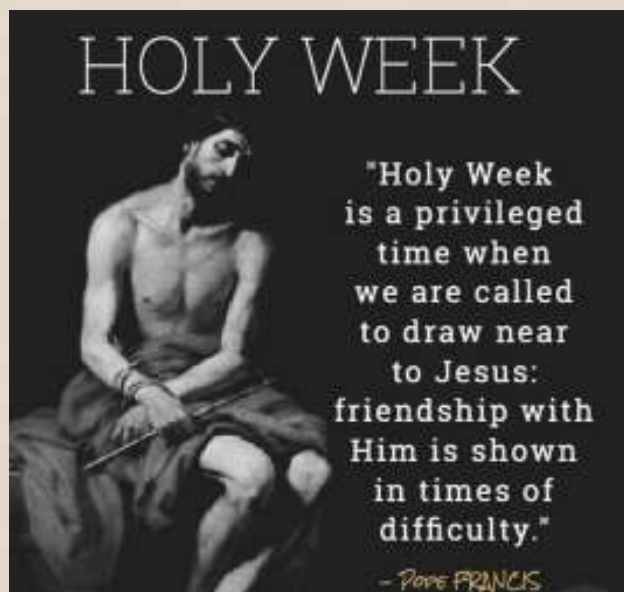
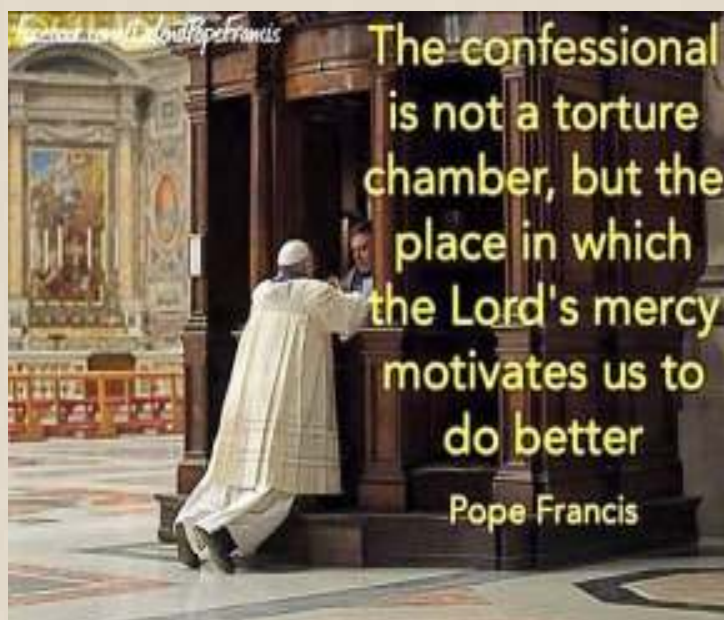
SPIRITUAL FORMATION:
